
The hotel you will be staying in Montevideo, Hotel Punta Trouville, lies in between the neighborhoods of Pocitos and Punta Carretas.

This is the entrance of the faculty:






## There was a change of room for the school


It will take place in room 101 of the math department. There are going to be a couple of coffee breaks with food and beverages. For lunch, you have some few options (unfortunately the canteen will be closed):




Except for El Faro de Ingeniería (that I do not recommend), I think you can go to all the other places marked in red.

Montevideo is famous for its coast line from the Old City to Carrasco's neighborhood. The city is also well known for its cultural life and architecture. In the Old City you can find also a good number of Art Deco buildings:











Uruguay is also famous for its meat. If you want to find good BBQ you can go for instance on saturday 16 at noon to Mercado del Puerto (albeit expensive) in the Old City.

## About payment in general

You can pay with a credit card for almost everything in Uruguay, but we recommend always carrying some cash with you (ej: 4000 Uruguayan pesos ~ 100 dollars). It could help to bring two cards if you have them. If you change at the airport, change only the minimum, you can change in many other places everywhere in the city indeed (the shops are called "Cambio").

## **Safety**

Uruguay is a relatively safe country, even more so in Punta del Este. Still, of course, take the usual precautions with your bags and documents (once in the hotel leave them in the safe, it is unnecessary to carry them with you).
